VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION



The VR Department continues to reach our goals despite the ongoing pandemic. Daily screenings, requiring face coverings, enforcing social distancing and handwashing throughout the community and onsite has aided in ensuring our clients and staff remain safe. We continue to use remote job developing and job coaching techniques via phone and video chat. Employment has been acquired by our consumers in Bertie, Martin, and Beaufort County and 13 Work Adjustment clients and 11 Supported Employment clients have been placed this quarter. We have

been able to request an increase in our WA and SE goals, increasing our overall revenue potential for the 20-21 FY. COVID-19 will not keep us down!

We would like to extend a special thank you to Rose Acres Egg Farm of Pantego, Flagstone Foods, Food Lion of Robersonville, The Learning Center of Washington, Brooks Construction, and Perdue Farms of Lewiston, NC. A few of these sites have provided opportunities for ME to hire local drivers to ensure individuals get to and from work daily, further contributing to VR consumer success. These local businesses have assisted our consumers in obtaining meaningful employment in the past and willingly continue to do so now. The VR Department encourages you to Shop Local!

Our Community Based Work Adjustment Pilot Program is set to resume in October. It was temporarily put on hold due to the pandemic. Only the MCC site will be open during this time, limiting the skills training to filing and janitorial duties. We look forward to restarting this venture next Quarter with special thanks to Mrs. Judy Jeanette, Director of Communications / Public Information Officer of MCC! The Pilot Program was set up to provide onsite training through Vocational Evaluation and WA Training. It is still the desire for individuals to be trained for a variety of work skills not limited to, but including janitorial, server, stocker, filing, food prep, and customer service.

We want to partner with you to continue serving our community and helping our clients reach success. When consumers work, we all win!
