To provide opportunities, training, and supports for individuals, to assist them in becoming as independent as possible at home, at work, and in the community.

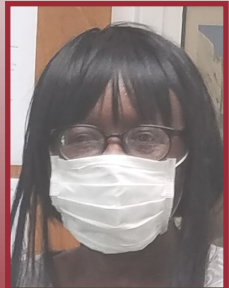

Martin Enterprises’ day staff provided services that were customized to suit each client willing to receive services in their homes or in group homes. Staff practiced social distancing, wore masks, used sanitizer and disinfectants during home visits.





MARTIN ENTERPRISES, during fiscal year 2019-2020, operated an Adult Developmental Vocational Program, a Community Living Facility Support program, two group homes, a Vocational Rehabilitation Services program, an Innovations-I/DD Waiver program, and Psychosocial Rehabilitation Services.

Throughout the **2019-2020 VR** fiscal year **56 clients** were job ready after going through our program and placed on various jobs in the community. (45 WA and 11 SE). The following businesses/industries hired one or more of our clients during this time period: Perdue Farms, Mega Force, HTM, Clara Manor, Solid Foundations, Domino's Pizza, Subway, Dollar General, Pinnacle Home Care, Food Lion, Rose Acres Egg Farm, Home Depot, Dollar Tree, The Learning Center, Edge of The Woods, Wilson Cleaning Service, Brooks Construction, Jernigan Oil, and Comp-millennia. We had **49 clients** that received WA/JC only and received major benefits.

PRODUCTION

PRODUCTION YEAR IN REVIEW:

During our 2019-2020 fiscal year, Martin Enterprises completed sub-contract work for several companies and sold recycled and baled corrugated material to Carolina Fibre of Greensboro. The following is a snapshot of the year:

Martin Enterprises operates a recycling center for the collection and processing of corrugated materials. In addition to the obvious environmental benefits, this center provides local industries, businesses, and residents a considerable financial incentive to recycle corrugated material instead of depositing it into the county landfill.
