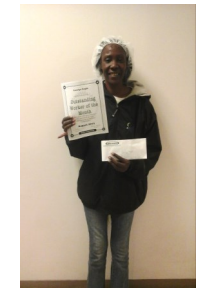

### Vocational Rehabilitation Services

The Vocational Rehabilitation department remains busy and has been transitioning and converting to the BEAM computer system. A total of 44 clients were successfully placed with gainful employment during the fiscal year, inclusive of 9 placements for the 3rd quarter. As motivation to be positive during the training process, the VR in-House consumers Worker of the Month and Perfect Attendance awards are granted to those who meet the criteria of quality performance, attendance, behavior, and production, ability to stay on task, team work, and dedication. The consumer is awarded a paid meal card, Worker of the Month certificate, and 50 tokens for use in the Reward Gallery as an incentive towards his/her hard work and dedication. A 'Worker of the Month' was selected for each month of the quarter.
