board and electronic waste. Quite often people ask "what do you do with all of that?" Most think we reuse the electronics and are not sure about the cardboard.



Electronic waste is

a huge commodity and has been for a number of years. With the number of "new" items that hit the market every year, there are plenty of "old" machines, phones and other gadgets out there. I dare to say that everyone reading this has "something" in their home or office that is no longer being used.

While most of these "old" items have some value, due to the gold and copper in them, the old monitors (the big heavy bulky ones) are tough to deal with due to the makeup of the product. They are banned from land fields and finding a company to take them is tough but possible.

We collect electronics from individuals and from various companies, palletize the material and sell it by weight to a processor in NC. ME has been collecting cardboard from local people and companies for years. The material is baled inside the facility, picked up and taken to a processing facility in Raleigh.

We do all this for two or actually three reasons: keeps material out of the land field, gives people work and brings in additional financial support for the programs we operate here for people with disabilities. It is definitely a "win, win" on both sides. We appreciate the companies in the area who support these efforts.
