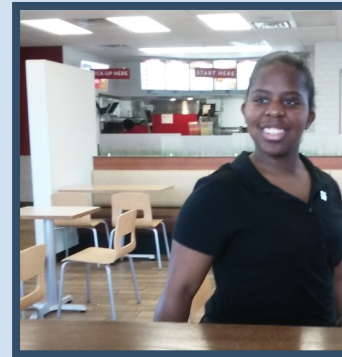
MISSION STATEMENT

Throughout the **2017-2018** VR fiscal year **52clients** were job ready after going through our program and placed on various jobs in the community. (41 WA and 11 SE). The following businesses/industries hired one or more of our clients during this time period: Mega Force/Ann’s House of Nuts, Mega Force/Martin Enterprises, HTM Concepts of Martin Enterprises, Wendy’s, Perdue, Bojangles, KFC, ABM, PAS, Syfan, Three Rivers, Lowe’s, IDX Impressions, Windsor House, Executive Personnel, Coastal Staffing, Beaufort County Schools, Holiday Inn Express, Val’s Home Healthcare, and others. We had **41 clients** that received WA/JC only and received major benefits.

PRODUCTION

PRODUCTION YEAR IN REVIEW:

During our 2017-2018 fiscal year, Martin Enterprises completed sub-contract work for several companies and sold recycled and baled corrugated material to Carolina Fibre of Greensboro. The following is a snapshot of the year:

- Perdue** Padded 8,498,155 poultry trays
- Hampton Arts** Filled 379,529 tubes of beads
- Hampton Arts** Painted 1,872 planks
- Ann’s House of Nuts** Assembled and Packaged 2,469 displays
- Cardboard** Recycled and baled 205.96 tons of cardboard
- Penco** Assembled 22,961 locker latch channels
- Fastenal** Assembled 1,318 locker hardware kits

Martin Enterprises operates a recycling center for the collection and processing of corrugated materials. In addition to the obvious environmental benefits, this center provides local industries, businesses, and residents a considerable financial incentive to recycle corrugated material instead of depositing it into the county landfill.
