VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION

Martin Enterprises, located in Williamston, NC, recently hired Yolanda Belcher, as Community Employment Specialist. Martin Enterprises also re-hired a retired employee, Linda Carter, as a Vocational Rehabilitation Training and Resource Assistant. They will join VR Services Manager, Sonona Jefferson, and current Community Employment Specialist, Randell Duggins, in assisting Vocational Rehabilitation clients in finding jobs in Bertie, Beaufort, Hertford, Martin, and Washington Counties.

Linda, a native of Martin County, grew up in Robersonville, NC. She graduated from East End High School and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from the University of St. Augustine in Raleigh, NC. She worked at Martin Enterprises for 36 years as a Community Employment Specialist (CES) before retiring in 2015. Linda is an active board member of the Faith Community Outreach food pantry in Robersonville, NC and serves as a volunteer in food distribution. She is passionate about helping people and being as resourceful as she can be. She hopes to help support the continued success of Martin Enterprises and the Vocational Rehabilitation department.

Yolanda, a Williamston native, worked in Raleigh as an Administrative Assistant for IBM for a year and a half, after graduating from Williamston High School. She returned to Williamston, over 20 years ago, to work in the mental health field with Elite Care Incorporated and then with Uprising Homes. She serves on the Youth and Women's Committee and is a Teen Sunday School Teacher at United Holy Church of Deliverance. Her goal is to work with Martin Enterprises and do as much as she can to help the developmentally disabled live and thrive in their community.

Vocational Rehabilitation helps persons with functional, psychological, developmental, cognitive and emotional impairments or health disabilities to overcome barriers to accessing, maintaining or returning to employment. VR either works with the person to find employment or refers them to agencies like Martin Enterprises for assistance in finding the client a community job.

Hiring people through this program, quite often guarantees a dedicated employee. An employer also may receive free on-site training for the employee, and the ability to get Federal Tax Credits. STRAWBERRY PICKING WITH MITCH FROM TRILLIUM




